Town Hall Crowd to Learn about Disaster Recovery

Sen. Zenzinger's third edition of monthly meeting is March 15



ARVADA, Colo. (March 6, 2014) – State Sen. Rachel Zenzinger's third Town Hall meeting March 15, presented in collaboration with Rep. Tracy Kraft-Tharp, will feature a discussion about the ways in which Colorado is likely to respond in the future to disasters such as large-scale floods and fires.

The 10:30 a.m. meeting at the Indian Tree Golf Course Club House will include an appearance by [Molly Urbina](#), who just started in the role as Colorado's chief recovery officer less than a month ago.

Sen. Zenzinger and Rep. Kraft-Tharp hold their town hall meeting the third Saturday of every month. During the meeting, members of the public are welcome to ask questions about legislative issues and provide input. The meeting is designed to promote interaction with the state legislators representing the people of Arvada and Westminster; and to help those residents become more informed about activities at the State Capitol most likely to affect them. There is no charge for attendance.

Sen. Zenzinger's first Town Hall meeting was Jan. 18, where the focus was the Colorado budget and economy. Her second Town Hall was Feb. 15, where the focus was public education.

Sen. Rachel Zenzinger serves Colorado Senate District 19, which spans most of Arvada and the Jefferson County portion of Westminster. She was appointed to her seat and sworn into office on Dec. 13, 2013.
